DIRECTOR OF PROGRAMS

I would like to extend greetings to the families and members of A Place Called Home and our extended network of friends and supporters. As the Director of Programs I am committed to the rich and dynamic opportunities for every member of APCH to receive academic support, to gain exposure and training in music, dance, art and our newly launched digital media lab.

I am privileged to work for an agency that also understands that the well being of our members, requires a holistic menu of programs that also includes nutrition, counseling, and fitness.

Last spring APCH joined forces with FilAm Arts, an arts and presenting organization, on a federally funded project to design a creative digital media laboratory. We've introduced filmmaking, digital graphics, and expanded our digital recording program through this partnership. Our music department is a national program site for the City Music Program of the Berklee College of Music. We've started a basketball league with several neighborhood youth centers and Kids In Sports LA, and we are creating a vegetable garden and working with a USC Clinical Study Program to help reduce obesity, diabetes, and heart disease in children. We are also working diligently to develop stronger relationships with each of the community schools where our members attend, and we are expanding our Shaheen Scholarship program to award 60 scholarships to members of A Place Called Home to attend colleges and universities across the country.

Our goal is to provide a safe place for our members to grow and learn the life and social competency skills to enable them to walk confidently in the world with a sense of purpose. If we can stimulate and inspire their imagination and desire to succeed through our programs, then we are honored to help jumpstart the lifelong process of discovery. The staff at APCH is committed. ART DEPARTMENT – FALL 2010

Since day one of the fall quarter, members have been flocking to the art room to participate in a variety of classes. Sewing class teaches children of all ages how to make basic stitches and to use those skills to make tissue cases and tote bags. The comic book workshop is back by popular demand with instructor Javier Hernandez, an established, published comic book artist. Hernandez is a positive influence and engages members as he teaches them the fundamentals of creating sequential art and character design. This season APCH Art Coordinator Bernyce Talley introduced the Eco and Fiber Art class where recycled items are used to conceptualize art pieces. Cans and bottles become decoupage vases, cardboard

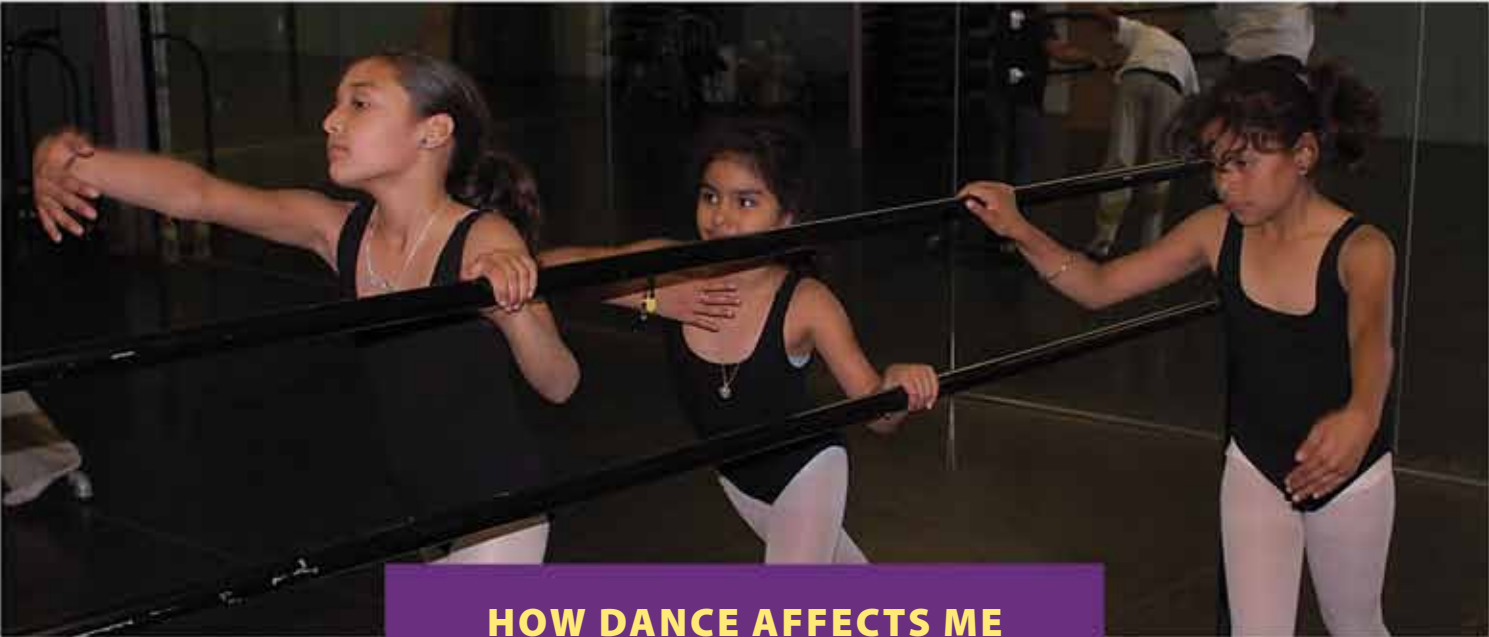
boxes form skeleton models and students use recycled fabrics to manipulate cloth through tie dying, weaving, and silk screening. Thursday the Painting and drawing class students learn color theory, still life painting, and shading and rendering. They employ various mediums ranging from pastels, watercolors, and acrylic using physical subjects as their muse. Thanks to a grant from California Consumer Protection Foundation and the Ahmanson Foundation, in conjunction with the traditional/visual art program, Bernyce teaches two graphic design classes. The beginner and intermediate students use Adobe Photoshop to manipulate artwork and photos to make collages and flyers for events at APCH.

My name is Elijah Doureseau and I am an APCH/Shahen Scholarship recipient attending Colorado College. My first year of college was incredible. I took challenging, cool classes, joined great organizations and made terrific friends. The summer break would be just as amazing...

I started my summer with a trip to Haiti with an organization that does relief work around the world. We were going to do demolition work outside of Port au Prince, traveling by ‘tap-tap’ in the daytime and resting in a compound in the evening. Thankfully, the earthquakes didn’t completely destroy the buildings we were cleaning up. The foundations were still intact so we cleared those off so the community could make temporary homes on top of them.

We were in Haiti for ten days, working and hanging out with workers whose lives were touched by the earthquakes in January. It was May, just four months since the earthquakes, and a lot of the workers had lost family members and many were displaced from their homes and still, one could feel a strong sense of hope in their hearts. The earthquake was devastating but it could not destroy their will to get themselves and their families back on their feet. They were powerful people doing some

good for their country.

Following the trip in Haiti, I was a Warner Bros. REACH intern for the second time. It was wonderful. I was in the Feature Story Department, the library of scripts for Warner Bros. Movie screenplays get processed and are given to other departments to be developed into movies. The department also does a lot of work with the Writers Guild of America, making sure the writing credits for movies are correct and updated.

My daily tasks included making copies of scripts for other departments and movie executives and doing filing jobs for the movies the studio was producing. As a writer, I learned a lot about writing in the entertainment industry and was able to examine the development process of stories and characters. I had a blast meeting new people and it was fun to check out what was being produced on the lot.

One of the best parts of the program was the fellowship with other interns. It was motivating to work and learn alongside people my own age that were just as passionate about exploring their career paths. The summer was busy, lively and

exciting. Now I’m in my second year of college and I’m looking forward to good times!

A SHAHEEN SCHOLAR CHECKS IN

As college tuition costs increase in California, no one is impacted more than young people in communities like South Central Los Angeles, where families are barely getting by. Through the leadership and steady support of David and Linda Shaheen, A Place Called Home has been providing tangible support for youth with college aspirations since 2002. Starting with just seven students the first year, the program has expanded steadily. This fall there are 58 APCH/Shahen Scholars attending schools across the country, including one in graduate school. The vast majority are the first in their families to graduate from high school and go on to college. The College Access Foundation of California recently recognized our scholarship program as the “Gold Standard” and has joined the Shaheens to help meet the tuition needs of APCH members going on to higher education. Last year a Huffington Post article raised more than \$12,000 from individuals who support the vision of first generation college attendance for students who would otherwise not have the opportunity. All told, APCH will award more than \$230,000 in scholarship and living expenses for Shahen Scholars this year!

The demand and competition for scholarship participation continues to increase as more and more young people come to A Place Called Home to realize their dreams. Students like Elijah Doureseau at Colorado Col-

lege; Geric Preston at San Jose State University; Tania Contreras at University of California Los Angeles; Laura Padilla at Berklee College of Music; Chris Martin at Loyola Marymount Law School, and dozens more have beaten the odds and are fulfilling their dreams thanks to the Shaheen Scholarship. To date 27 students have graduated from community colleges and four-year universities. Three more will graduate this year.

For Linda and David Shaheen, the motive is simple: *“Education is the most important thing – there’s nothing more impactful that we can do for society than to educate our children. The most disenfranchised group is inner-city youth, that’s why we choose to initiate and support the scholarship program at A Place Called Home.”*

We are committed to advancing the educational aspirations of young people in South Central, and the numbers and needs are growing. This year we are adding a Pathways component to our program, to provide additional practical, planning and emotional support to ensure the success of Shahen Scholars. Following the lead of the Shaheens, and with the partnership of the College Access Foundation of California and private donors like you, a new generation of bright young minds is being prepared to become the leaders and shapers of tomorrow.

AT APCH ANYTHING IS POSSIBLE INCLUDING COLLEGE!

My name is Christopher Martin, and I have been a member of A Place Called Home since 1998. I can honestly say that A Place Called Home was a beacon of light for me, and I am thankful that it continues to be a blessing to many other youth in South Central Los Angeles. A Place Called Home gave me an alternative to the gang violence I saw in my community, for I could easily have ended up a negative product of my environment. APCH gave me food to eat when I was hungry, introduced me to friends when I was lonely and mentored me when I needed guidance.

The Shaheen Scholarship Program has played a tremendous role in ensuring that I get through college and matriculate on to higher education. On more than one occasion I remember being down to my last dollar when that timely check that would keep me going arrived in the mail. It feels good to know that you have people in your corner who are rooting for you to succeed, not only that, but they believe that you can! Because of the Shaheen’s contri-

butions to my education, I am going to law school!

I used the scholarship to apply to 25 law schools. So far, I have been accepted into Penn State, University of Louisville, Syracuse, Michigan State, Southwestern, and the Charlotte School of Law, and have been waitlisted at Notre Dame, University of Minnesota, Pepperdine and Depaul. I have even been blessed to be recruited by an Ivy League school, Cornell! Right now, I’m waiting on about fifteen other great schools, including USC. Getting my education will enable me to help the children of South Central and give back to the community like A Place Called Home and the Shaheen Scholarship did for me. If there’s anything APCH has taught me, it is this—never give up because you can make it, and when you do, don’t forget to help others who need help. From the bottom of my heart, God bless A Place Called Home!

APCH PROVIDES FREE DENTAL CLINIC FOR FAMILIES IN SOUTH CENTRAL

Again this summer, APCH partnered with the USC Ayuda Dental Clinic to provide free services to 110 members of our South Central community. APCH's 10,000 square foot facility was converted into a dental and oral surgery center for one full day. Led by Dr. Richard Done, more than 70 dentists and students from the USC School of Dentistry provided cleaning and preventative procedures. If extended care was required, patients were referred for treatment through the Ayuda Clinic on the USC campus.

In an interview on channel 22 the evening before the clinic Dr. Done mentioned treatment would be available to community members. Beginning at 6:00 in the morning dozens of our members and their siblings and other community members lined up to receive treatment, including a woman who had taken the bus from Pacoima.

We are grateful to Dr. Done, his staff and students for providing this much needed service. Thank you!

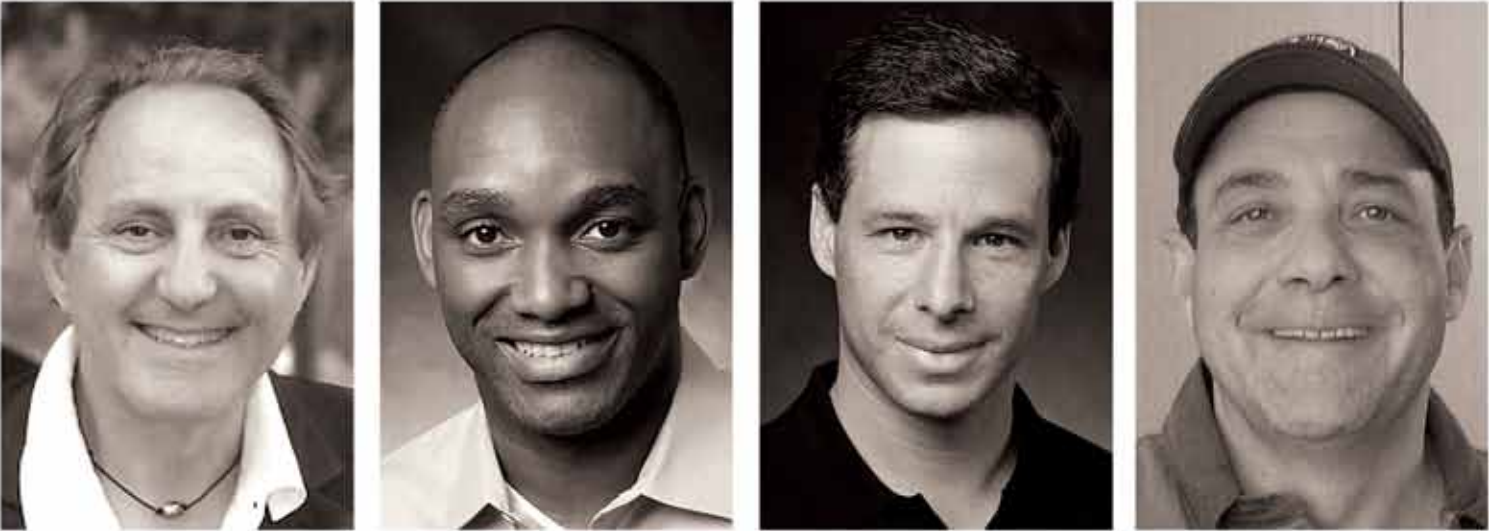

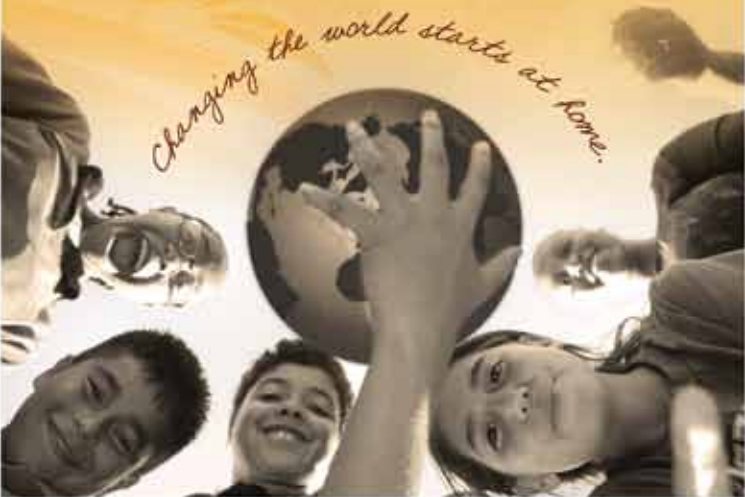
